LISTRY Community Council is one of many excellent organisations working diligently for its community. An active council on many fronts, its core activity is in providing a childcare facility on a daily basis from 8am to 6pm. Meals on wheels, education and training, Irish dancing is but a sample of the activities Listry Community Council facilitate.

This group has availed of the Rural Social Scheme for years, as it provides them with caretaking and general maintenance services. Tony Darmody of Listry Community Council explains that this is an invaluable service which has helped it to prosper. One of the group's strengths is that it invites people to take part in events rather than simply asking them to attend meetings. This is a more interactive approach. "They (SKDP) have been very helpful to us and we've always found them very good to work with. From supervisors to RSS and Tús participants, the relationship has been very beneficial to us," said Tony.

The aim of the council is to facilitate and work with other groups. In a small parish it is vital to work together, while Tony insists that Listry Community Council have led the way with the weekly lotto, run in conjunction with Listry GAA Club.

"The council helps to bring different groups together and we have a core membership of 24 people that are registered members. The board comprises of seven people and they are responsible for the governance of the council. We're an enabling and a facilitating group," said Tony.
